And last summer, Daphne interned for California State Assemblyman Jose Medina, an alumnus of UC Riverside. Under Assemblyman Medina, she helped preview bills and worked on his newsletter and social media accounts.

Daphne is interested in helping underserved communities and plans to pursue a law degree after graduating. In the meantime, she has applied to the UCLA Law Fellowship, which mentors and guides students until they apply to law school.
